
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Updates from Shekinah Christian School's Guidance Department

The NOBLE Academy program inspires students to consider their purpose and discern if they have what it takes to be an entrepreneur. The 6-session series takes students through each step toward starting their own businesses. NOBLE Academy utilizes the YEA! curriculum and offers the program in 6 sessions instead of the previous 30 weeks of classes.

We are excited to help teenagers and adults gain the tools they need to

turn their ideas into viable businesses. Registration is FREE. All materials are provided. A free meal is provided for each session. Anyone who completes all 6 sessions will have the opportunity to develop their own business plan, marketing strategies, and pitch. The 6th session gives students the opportunity to pitch their business to an

investor panel and be awarded funds to offset their start-up expenses.

They will receive help to file their business with the State of Ohio.
